**Laurel Wreath Making** – Let There Be Wreaths. Beginning Friday November 29<sup>th</sup> of Thanksgiving weekend through Sunday December 1<sup>st</sup> from 9 am until 4 pm, we will create, assemble, fashion, build and construct close to 60 big fluffy laurel wreaths, decked out with large pinecones and big red bows. **Gingerbread Fair** – Always held on the first Saturday in December. This year's fair on Saturday, December 7th from 9 am until 3 pm mixes community spirit and merriment for all. Come in and embrace the sights and fragrances of the season in our historic vestry.

**"Bird's in the Air" Country Quilt** – The Birds in the Air Quilt was originally designed by the wife of a Quaker. They ran Safe House #5. A clever quilter could indicate a direction of travel with the choice of fabric and placement of blocks.

This colorful quilt is done in shades of brown, green, blue and red. The backing material has a design of its own. The binding compliments the colors of the top and back of the quilt. The simple hand quilting tells a story of the Birds in the Air quilt square. This 100" x 100", queen sized, quilt is just right for any home and may be a future heirloom.
